- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every player and treat everyone equally within the context of football
- Always pursue fair play
- Prohibit use of camcorders and cameras unless parental consent has been provided
- Place safety and well-being of the player above the development of performance
- Be aware of the SFA's and Club's Child and Vulnerable Adult Protection Policy and Procedures
- Ensure that coaching sessions are enjoyable, well-structured and focus on developing skills, decision making and a general understanding of the game
- Develop an appropriate working relationship with players by building confidence, being motivational and working on a basis of mutual trust and respect
- Encourage players to accept responsibility for their own behaviour and performance
- Ensure that sessions and games are appropriate for the age, maturity, experience and ability of the individual
- During association matches stay within specified technical area as per the guidelines found in the 'Guidelines for Coaches' booklet
- Must at all times display exemplar standards of behaviour towards fellow and opposing team coaches, players, officials, volunteers and parents/guardians.
- Know where to find appropriate First Aid
- Maintain full 'Disclosure' as required by the Club
- Maintain appropriate training certification as required by the Club
- Hold a current membership list and have a register available at all activities
